

### Trifle a la Karen...

Serves 6-8

10-12 sponge fingers
Sherry for soaking (optional)
2 packets of raspberry jelly
Punnet of raspberries

Pint of custard ½ pint fresh whipped cream

#### **Method**

- 1. Dissolve the jellies in ½ pint of hot water and top up to 2 pints with cold water
- Line the bottom of a large glass bowl with the sponge fingers (pre-soaked in sherry, optional)
- 3. Cover the sponge with the fruit
- 4. Pour cooling jelly over the fruit and leave to set
- Make up the custard and when <u>cold</u> pour over the set jelly
- 6. Top with the whipped cream and decorate with left over fruit.

Wow! The Summer has seen our family grow considerably. Doubtless, it was all the sunshine!






### **Prehistoric Life**


