
Birthday wishes...

Back in the Day...

As we all know technology continually changes as something newer and better comes along. But one electronic device that's defied the test of time is the television.



It all began in the late 1920s with the mechanical form, pictured left. This was quickly replaced with the recognisable cathode ray tube TVs from 1936. The first British TV drama was Pirandello's 'The Man with a Flower in His Mouth' with the first major outside broadcast going out on 12/05/1937, of King George VI's coronation. At this point there were 9000 TVs owned. And, in 1948 there was the Queen's coronation.

Two days before Britain entered WW2, the plug was pulled on the BBC. A Mickey Mouse cartoon was the last to air. On their return in 1946, they began with the same cartoon! 1948 saw the first televised Olympics. Popularity grew rapidly into the 1960s with ownership rising to 15.1 million! Then there was colour! BBC2 from 01/07/1967, and BBC1 from 15/11/1969.

In response to the last editions 'Back in the day...', Colin shares a childhood memory of his mum's (Sheila) first car...

"It must have been the early 1960s, and after Mum had passed her driving test (she passed first time, Dad had to take it twice ;-) we bought 211 TDH, a two-tone maroon and grey Ford Anglia. On what must have been its first trip out, with Mum driving and me standing in the passenger footwell (no seat belts, no airbags, no head restraints, no health and safety), we drove along a quiet residential street and Mum decided to try a turn in the road (or a three-point turn as it used to be called).

It all went swimmingly until she had the front of the car facing the opposite pavement. It was then that she found out that she didn't know where reverse gear was on the gear lever. There was no marking on the gear knob as there is now, and I think we may still have been there a week later if a friendly local milkman hadn't stopped his round and found how to select reverse.

After that there was no stopping her, and throughout her driving career Mum was a far more competent and patient driver than Dad ever was, frequently driving from our house in Bexleyheath in Kent to visit her parents outside High Wycombe in Buckinghamshire, a distance of perhaps 100 miles, but without the benefits of the M25. Thinking about it, it was probably quicker then than now."



Pumpkin Soup

- 1 Pumpkin (deseeded, skinned & chopped into cubes)
- 2 medium onions chopped
- 2 pints of vegetable/chicken stock
- Salt & pepper
- ¼ pint double cream/crème fraiche (optional)

Method

- Put all the above ingredients (except cream) into a large pan and bring to the boil
- Turn down to a simmer and cook for a further 10-15 minutes (or until soft)
- Liquidise everything and adjust seasoning to taste
- Stir cream if desired.
