The morning raised £60.50 for the charity whilst being a wonderful social occasion. Thank you to everyone who took part.

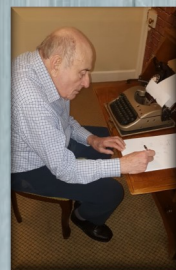

Maybe, they were laughing with fear?





Pumpkin Cake

250g All purpose flour
2tsp Baking Powder
1tsp Baking Soda
1tsp Salt
1½tsp Ground Cinnamon
2tsp Pumpkin Pie Spice
240ml Vegetable oil
4 large eggs
200g light/dark brown sugar
100g granulated sugar
1 can of Pumpkin puree (5 ounce) or fresh pumpkin puree
1½tsp pure vanilla extract



Method

- Mix flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and pumpkin spice in a large mixing bowl and set aside
- Whisk oil, eggs, sugars, pumpkin and vanilla extract together until combined and pour into dry ingredients
- Use a mixer / whisk until combined - the batter will be thick
- Spread into a prepared tin and bake for 30 - 35 minutes at 350°F / 177°C. Baking times may vary so keep a close eye. A skewer will come out clean. TIP If edges browning too quickly cover with foil / parchment.
- Make frosting whilst cake is cooling.

225g Full fat block cream cheese - room temp
115g unsalted butter - room temp
360g icing sugar
1tsp pure vanilla extract
Few drops of orange food colouring - optional

Method

- Beat cheese and butter on a high speed until smooth and creamy
- Add remaining ingredients and beat on a low speed
- Spread over the cooled cake and...

Tip!

The cake can be kept in an airtight container and stored in the fridge for up to 5 days

Try and keep those leaves away as they're not good for the lawn.

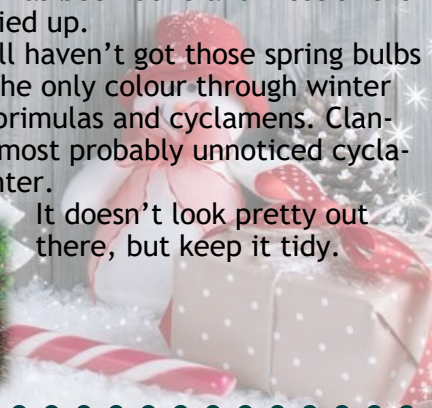
Any geraniums, dahlias, calla lilies etc.
